Call for Abstracts

The purpose of the symposium is to bring together people from throughout the Truckee River watershed in California and Nevada to share their research, knowledge and activities. This sharing will aid in understanding of watershed complexities and interactions, and possible links of ramifications of various actions upon another. All of these details are necessary in the protection of the Truckee River as we look to the future. This symposium is an opportunity for a forum to bring critical Truckee River issues; including drought, water resources, flood, pollution, regulations, effects of climate change, and political considerations, to the table for robust discussion.

Don't wait! Don't wait, as this is the perfect opportunity to communicate/exchange new/updated data/information, update project progress, and to collaborate/coordinate with your colleagues on new ideas/plans. The symposium will consist of brief presentations describing work along the Truckee River from the headwaters at Lake Tahoe to its terminous at Pyramid Lake, and the policy that drives the work being described. Presentations from professionals, citizens and students will be considered.

Please submit your electronic abstract (no more than 250 words in subject length) and a one-page biography in WORD or ASCII format by May 31, 2011 to Tina Triplett, NWRA, at creativerno@charter.net. Abstracts need to include author/coauthors name(s), institution, full address, e-mail address, and telephone numbers. Also include your preference of oral vs. poster presentation as well as your selected topic session (listed above) including any special audiovisual requirements. All presentations will be selected based upon the review of abstracts and all submissions (accepted or not) will receive email/mail notification from NWRA.

All selected oral and poster presenters will need to register for the symposium.

Accepted oral presentations need to be in PowerPoint format and must be electronically submitted by August 31, 2011 to Tina Triplett, NWRA, at creativerno@charter.net.

All selected abstracts will be published and handed out at the symposium and available on-line at NWRA website, <http://www.nvwra.org/>. Selected abstract authors will also be invited to prepare papers for inclusion in a special issue of the *Journal of the Nevada Water Resources Association* focused on Truckee River issues. Selected papers will be peer-reviewed for inclusion in the journal. Please indicate if you would like to have your paper considered for inclusion in the Truckee River edition of JNWRA.
